Maintaining a Sustainable Future

Oxford House of Tennessee launched an incredible statewide workshop that brought education and training directly to the members we serve. From the newest Houses in Bristol, to the well-established Houses of Memphis, OHTN is stretched over 500mi. Taking time off work or traveling without transportation are some of the barriers the membership have reported that prevent them from attending large events such as the OHTN convention. OHI staff state developed a plan to ensure that anyone seeking the camaraderie and knowledge found at these events could easily access it; right at their doorstep!

The Memphis heat is beginning to subside and with it our vacancies. A lot of wonderful things happened this Summer. Since July, we have been approved access to the Women's Jail by the Shelby County Corrections Division. Geremy Wilkerson (OHI) and myself were asked to present the Oxford House Model at one of the largest recovery treatment centers in Memphis. They have referred applicants to us in the past, but this was the first time Oxford House outreach has been invited in to explain our purpose, history and structure. We provide men and women in recovery a safe environment to start again. I love every opportunity I get to share this message with the world. We have been asked to come back monthly.

Aside from the wonderful news, we've been busy with training workshops, preparing for the Mobilize Recovery Day of Service events, and fundraisers. The membership of Memphis recently held a carwash and raised \$600! We were also gifted a 10-day booth at the Delta Fair & Music Festival; which was donated by the brother of our Chapter 2 Chairperson. Thank you Aaron Renfro and Eric Johnson who provided last minute materials for us to hand out during the Fair.

Phenomenal Success


